Emergency Management After- Action Review Processes to Influence Ontario Municipalities

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Project Overview

Project Overview

- Created an outline for essential items within an AAR and discussed questionnaire results to compare methods in Ontario municipalities.

Results

 The OFMEM does not provide an AAR template, it was found that all three municipalities surveyed utilized a different approach or template for this tool that could be used to develop programs with little cost, if used to full potential.

Impact

 The OFMEM could develop a comprehensive AAR tool that could guide municipalities to develop a strong lessons learned program.

Capstone Challenges

- A challenge I experienced was keeping the flow of information clear and concise with such a large paper.
- Revisit the research question often to ensure you are staying within its parameters.
